Sticky Knowledge:

Why not try this week's 'sticky knowledge' questions with your children to see if they have retained this important information? It is crucial that we keep revising important knowledge with pupils to ensure they know and understand more as they progress through school. You could try the question for your child's year group and the ones for younger year groups to see what they can remember.

Pre-school - Can you retell the story of 'Stickman'?

Reception - Name 5 things that God created.

Year 1 - Can you recall words that contain the phoneme 'aw'? I will go first.. paw. Maybe you could write them in a sentence.

Year 2 - What is the meaning of the Advent wreath and what message would you share with your family about Advent?

Year 3 - What are the alternative spellings for the sound 'f'? Can you think of some words that start with the alternative spellings for 'f', eg. photograph

Year 4 - What is the difference between perimeter and area? Can you use a ruler to draw some squares and rectangles and then find the perimeter and area?

Year 5 - How many signs and symbols can you name from a baptism? Do you know their meaning?

Year 6 - Explain the meaning of the terms 'dividend, divisor and quotient' and how they can be identified in a division calculation. Can you write and answer some division questions?
