Sticky Knowledge:

Why not try this week's 'sticky knowledge' questions with your children to see if they have retained this important information? It is crucial that we keep revising important knowledge with pupils to ensure they know and understand more as they progress through school. You could try the question for your child's year group and the ones for younger year groups to see what they can remember.

Pre-school - Try and retell the story Elmer and the Rainbow to a grown up?

Reception - Explain what a nocturnal animal is and name 3 of them?

Year 1 - In History we have started exploring a significant event, the great fire of London. Can you remember where the fire started and how?

Year 2 - How many 3D shapes can you find around your house? Can you name them all?

Year 3 - What is perimeter? Can you measure perimeter if the shape is not closed? Measure the perimeter of some simple shapes in your house.

Year 4 - Explain what improper fractions and mixed numbers are. Can you give any examples?

Year 5 - Can you name the planets in our solar system in order from the Sun? Which ones are the rocky planets and which are the gas planets? Can you find out any interesting facts about our solar system?

Year 6 - Explain to an adult the difference between an algebraic expression, substitution, formula and an equation, from your algebra learning. Can you provide an adult with some examples of each form, to help explain their meaning?
